To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, *Miriam B. W. Thomas* of *Michigan Territory* had deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at *Detroit* whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said *Miriam B. W. Thomas* according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the South East quarter of the South East quarter of section *36* in Township *36* North of Range *10* East in the District of Lands subject to sale at *Detroit*, Michigan Territory, containing *160* acres according to the official plat of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said *Miriam B. W. Thomas*.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the purchase, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said *Miriam B. W. Thomas* and to her heirs, the said tract above described: To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature whatsoever belonging unto the said *Miriam B. W. Thomas* and her heirs, heirs and assigns forever.
